16 And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up: and, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read. Matt 13:54; Mark 6:1; John 4:43; Neh 8:4-5; 17 And there was delivered to him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when he had opened the book, he found the place where it was written, 18 The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he has sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, Isa 61:1; Matt 11:5; Isa 42:7; Isa 61:1-2; 19 To preach the acceptable year of the Lord. 20 And he closed the book, and he gave it again to the minister, and sat down. And the eyes of all them that were in the synagogue were fastened on him. 21 And he began to say to them, This day is this scripture fulfilled in your ears.

22 And all bore him witness, and wondered at the gracious words which proceeded out of his mouth. And they said, Is not this Joseph's son? Isa 50:4; Matt 13:54; Mark 6:2; Luke 2:47; John 6:42;

23 And he said to them, You will surely say to me this proverb, Physician, heal yourself: whatever we have heard done in Capernaum, do also here in your country. Matt 4:13; 24 And he said, Truly I say to you, No prophet is accepted in his own country. Matt 13:57; Mark 6:4; John 4:44; 25 But I tell you of a truth, many widows were in Israel in the days of Elias, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, when great famine was throughout all the land; 1 Kgs 17:7; Jas 5:17; 26 But to none of them was Elias sent, save to Sarepta, a city of Sidon, to a woman that was a widow. 27 And many lepers were in Israel in the time of Eliseus the prophet; and none of them was cleansed, saving Naaman the Syrian. 2 Kgs 5:14;

28 And all they in the synagogue, when they heard these things, were filled with wrath, 29 And rose up, and thrust him out of the city, and led him to the brow of the hill where on their city was built, that they might cast him down headlong.

30 But he passing through the middle of them went his way,

Luke 4: 13-30

When you come to Jesus and you are saved; you have to know that you will be rejected by many; some may be spouses, family, friends, a boss, co workers....it is not if it will happen, it does. Jesus himself was rejected and left by his self even the prophets forsaking him, but note also Jesus forgave them and called them back to Him, as in saying go and tell them.....go preach the Word. Jesus; loved them and forgave them, remember His last Words?? "Father forgive them, for they know not what they do." Jesus' statement not just for the people present that day, but also the prophets, in those days if you associated with someone convicted you were usually put to death also, so they ran, they were afraid. John 12:38; Rom 10:16; 2 For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he has no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him. 3 He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Ps 22:6-7; Isa 49:7; Isa 52:14; Mark 9:12; 4 Surely he has borne our grief, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. Matt 8:17; 5 But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was on him; and with his stripes we are healed. Rom 4:25; 1Cor 15:3; 1Pet 2:24; 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. 7 He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he opens not his mouth. Matt 26:63; Matt 27:12; Matt 27:14; Mark 14:61; Mark 15:5; Acts 8:32; 8 He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken. 9 And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth. 1Pet 2:22; 1John 3:5; 10 Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he has put him to grief: when you shall make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. 11 He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities. 12 Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he has poured out his soul to death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors. Mark 15:28; Luke 22:37; Luke 23:34;

If a person says they have nothing to be thankful for, than I pause and remember my last trial/testing it lasted almost 20 years, and I remember the pain, and guess I am supposed to, it is part of compassion knowing how others must feel. I am able to see the sides, all of them. I was rejected for almost 20 years...untouched, unloved in marriage.....I cried for almost 6 years every night before I went to sleep, I tried to talk to people, and explain to them what was happening, but know one believed me. Watching the man I loved turning into someone I did not know was a wful, To explain it, the medical term would be cardiac dementia, my healthy strong as steel, tough guy was changing right before my eyes. The man that held his breath when I walked by, my second marriage. A passionate, intelligent man, that did a 380, it broke my heart and spirit. The Holy Spirit had told me He was sending someone, I was at the end of my rope, my husband even had the doctors fooled. He (Holy Spirit) had said it will be someone much like Elijah strong in physical combat and spiritual warfare, I waited 3 years, looking and than that person came, they became a friend, came along beside me, prayed with me, studied the Word, and fellowshipped, encouraged me...it was Jesus, me, the friend.....and through our conversations I had learned I was trying to do it all my self...the friend encouraged me to let go and let God....first the people surrounding me causing hindrances were...to stay. So I struggled on, and God everything all gone....just gone....I had NO money, God than stepped in, and provision came, and actually though the ministry had been started, it started becoming stronger in 2002, He started opening doors. At one point I was in a almost fetal position curled up in a ball crying out, I can't take anymore, my friend kept saying yes, you can.....I lost everything in 6 years, and I mean everything. I had been praying all this time, so I changed the prayer and instead of healing I prayed to be delivered. My friend kept saying tears in a fort night and joy in the morning, and His mercies are new everyday. My husband than consented to the heart surgery he needed, and the day I was to bring him home, healed, two hours before I picked him up, he coded, had a massive coronary they brought him back twice, than he died. Ten years before this God healed him from alcoholism, and had healed his heart. God had been drawing him all this time, and he kept refusing, rejecting him....though he did accept Jesus just before he died. I am sitting there at home and I am going "why, God?" and the Holy Spirit said; he has fought many battles in his life, long one's and now his battles are over. See God did line everything up, even me having a friend someone to come along beside me, when everyone deserted me. I can only write about this now, because I am healed, I have many battle scars, but I can say what ever is thrown at you, God will not leave you or forsake you, ever. So if you cannot be thankful in your circumstances you can be thankful that He is with you.

The scripture that says..."He has anointed me to preach the good news....is very real to me....and than the other scripture that says.....no prophet is accepted welcome in his own town."..and I have not been, nor sometimes by friends or family or even a spouse. In all that time I kept thinking how Jesus was rejected...despised...how painful it had to have been on that cross.....and He bore it for us....that is love.

He blesses us, breaks us, than passes us out to go and preach the good news.

.....so be thankful....even in the trial....you may be broken and it may be hard to get back up....but He does give beauty for ashes....and those old battle scars, the warrior medals...are nothing compared to the whip lashes He suffered....when those people reject you....they are rejecting Him....so praise Him and give Him all the glory...for without Him we are nothing.....
