Scripture

9 But as it is written, Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God has prepared for them that love him. Isa 64:4; 10 But God has revealed them to us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God. Matt 13:11; 2Cor 3:18; 11 For what man knows the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knows no man, but the Spirit of God. 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Whatever man believes.....is what he practices.....

Jesus is out of the order of melchizedek....

We have three in Melchizedek; a king, a lord, a priest.....Jesus is all three.

Melchizedek.....

King of righteousness, king of Salem, and also priest of the most high God, in which capacity he blessed Abraham, and received tithes at his hand, Genesis 14:18-20. Scripture tells us nothing of his father or mother, of his genealogy, his birth, or his death; he stands alone, without predecessor or successor, a royal priest by the appointment of God; and thus he was a type of Jesus Christ, who is "a priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek," and not after the order of Aaron, whose origin, consecration, life, and death, are known, Psalm 110:4 Hebrews 7:1-28 (Biblos.com)

God the Father; God the Son; God the Holy Spirit....

The "knowledge party" came in for the brunt of Paul's scathing rebuke. Corinth was close to Athens, where the atmosphere was dominated by egoists who paraded themselves as philosophers. The spirit of Athens had penetrated the church in Corinth.

Paul was a university man, an outstanding scholar of his generation. But Paul despised any pedantic show of learning. True learning and true scholarship should make us humble and more broadminded toward the "ignorant" who may not have our knowledge but who may be our superiors in wisdom and spiritual understanding. (whoa this brings me back to my beginning of my love walk.....I had all these questions.....and would ask someone in church....and they would respond or look at me like your saved and you don't know?? In the beginning I had trouble understanding the Holy Spirit so when I asked.... for them to explain...I was called pagan. I had thought that the Holy Spirit was a angel, and did not understand He is part of the deity, part of God. Even today the Holy Spirit is not explained well or the deity, by very few pastors. The statement that brings that into focus, is; God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit. Three in one, but each with their own distinct personalities. So, I learned when I have a question and some people will not answer simply and honestly.....most of the time.....they don't know either....so when I am asked something.....and I don't know the answer....I say....I am not quite sure but I will look it up or say.....we can look it up together and research it. So if someone cannot answer your questions or they have....a attitude....seek someone wiser....for council.....I myself like the mentoring one on one with new believers.)

Paul contrasts the wisdom of God with the wisdom of the unbelieving world. The world's wisdom of God with the wisdom of the unbelieving world. The world's wisdom fails to recognize God by means of its own philosophy. So God sent Christ, who is the wisdom of God (v. 24), to reveal to us a knowledge of the divine plan of salvation that had until then been a mystery. Now God's wisdom is revealed to believers through the Holy Spirit. (Halley's Bible Handbook; 2000; history & commentaries; page 778)

26 For you see your calling, brothers, how that not many wise men after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called: John 7:48; Jas 2:5; 27 But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise; and God has chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty; 28 And base things of the world, and things which are despised, has God chosen, yes, and things which are not, to bring to nothing things that are: 1 Corin. 1:26-28

(v. 2) For I resolved to know nothing (to be acquainted with nothing, to make a display of the knowledge of nothing and to be conscious of nothing) among you except Jesus Christ (the Messiah) and Him crucified. 1 Corin. 2:2

This verse gives us the message of Paul's preaching. Paul's preaching was emonstration of God's Spirit and power. "Perfect" means complete. The wisdom of the world hasn't revealed to man the glorious things God wants to do for us. We who have received His grace are experiencing the blessings of being His children. (v. 9) Many people misinterpret this verse as referring to future things God will do for us, but the next verse shows Paul's intention more clearly. The Spirit brings us to an understanding of God and His plans for our lives. The natural man is blinded to spiritual things. "Judgeth" means understands. The Holy Spirit gives us knowledge beyond our experience. Philipp. 2:5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Matt 11:29; John 13:15; 1Pet 2:21; 1John 2:6; (New Testament Study Guide; 2005; Chuck Smith; commentaries; page 82)

Do you sometimes hesitate to share about God because you are not sure what to say? Even Paul, a great evangelist and teacher, did not count on flowery speech or his ability to persuade people, he depended on the Holy Spirit to speak through him. 1 Corin. 2:5, teaches us not to put our faith in human wisdom or philosophy, but in the power of God. (v. 11) says that no one discerns the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. Since the Holy Spirit knows the secret counsel of God, it is a vital necessity for us to know how to hear what He wants to say to us. The Holy Spirit helps us realize and comprehend and appreciate the gifts of divine favor and blessing that God bestows on us. Human wisdom does not teach us this truth; it comes from the Holy Spirit, Who gives us the mind of Christ. (1 Corin. 2:12-16)

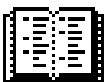
