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The Centurion's Servant... A Centurion (also in Matthew 8:5-13) was a Roman officer in charge of a hundred soldiers, at that time Palestine had been under Roman control about a hundred years. Roman officers, all too generally, were brutal and despised men, some of them influenced by Jewish religion, were good men. The first Gentile to be received into the Church was a Centurion, named Cornelius (Acts 10). The Centurion had built the Jews their synagogue in Capernaum (5), in this same synagogue Jesus had often taught, and had healed the demoniac (Mark 1:21-23). In 1905 a German expedition uncovered the remains of a synagogue which appeared to have been built in the 4th century A.D. and under it the floor of a still older synagogue which is thought to have been the actual synagogue in which Jesus taught the Scribes and Pharisees sat. The pulpit was at the north end. One may see almost the exact spot where the Lord stood.

Son of Nain's Widow Raised...This is one of the three resurrections (Mark 5:22, John 11:1) Jesus may have raised others (Luke 7:22). He commissioned the twelve to raise the dead (Matthew 10:8). (Halley's Bible Handbook; 1965; Luke; page 502)

Messengers from John...(Matthew 11:1-19). John thought that Jesus would take over the government and get rid of the wicked King Herod. Jesus realized that John knew the scriptures concerning the Messiah, and that Jesus was fulfilling them all. John was in the king's prison. John was a harsh prophet, and the Pharisees criticized him. Jesus was kind, loving, and gregarious, and the Pharisees criticized Him. So John sent the men to Jesus and said; "Are You the One Who is to come or shall we look for another?" Jesus, was healing many of sicknesses and distressing bodily plagues and evil spirits, and to many who were blind He gave sight. So He replied to them. Go and tell John what you have seen and heard; the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the poor have the good news preached to them. Blessed is he who takes no offense in Me and who is not hurt or resentful or annoyed or repelled or made to stumble [whatever may occur]. The messengers departed. John was having some doubt to if Jesus was the Messiah, because he as the prophets thought that Jesus would take over the government, and would be the King. Makes some of the scripture clearer doesn't it, the prophets and the other people whom did not understand thought that Jesus would take over the government than and be king, and I assume they probably thought they may be in positions to serve under Jesus. Jesus did explain it to them several times, and than the day He was on the Cross it must have been hard realizing that they did not listen completely, sort of listened but put their own thoughts in it. Don't we all do that from time to time though, someone will come up with a plan we have the basic outline of the plan, but we finish it and fill in the blank spaces, than we start working on the plan with the original planner, and discover that what we had though and planned was not correct, we were not listening clearly. Jesus knew the plan, where as we hardly ever know the whole plan, He gives it to us step by step, and that is for a reason; so He gets all the glory and we cannot say "I" did it myself, it was all me...when in reality it is all God it was never us. My last trial lasted 19 years, but what I did not tell you was the simple truth; if I had listened to God when the Holy Spirit tried to warn me, I would not have spent 19 more years in the dessert. The warning signs were there, too, and I did not heed them; it did not line up exactly with scripture as God will not go against His Word, and I did not listen, and it all turned out just like He warned me. If you have NO peace about something or a plan and there is NO peace, seek God, pray and ask, search the scripture, and ask for confirmation. The Holy Spirit has said He is restoring me, and He is, everything that was lost has been restored, the only thing not restored is the 19 years, and He said restoration for the years of what the locus has eaten, but time I don't know, I am not God and I don't have all the answers only what He teaches me, I do know He (Holy Spirit) said restoration, so I do believe the time lost will be restored to, it may not be as how we think, but His ways are higher. All I am going to say on your plans, ask Him, seek Him, ask for confirmation and listen to Him intently. Under stand He does not have to correct our errors, when we are doing our will and not His will, He did take my errors and use it for His purpose just like the Word says; people were helped; a ministry was birthed; I went to seminary; the writing's were started, virtual chapel's though small are on the net....so He did take the circumstances and turn them to good for His purpose....what was meant for my harm, He used for His good....do you see it....?? It is all to His glory, and quite obvious I did not do the plan or effect, just was His hands and feet and I love it, He is right I am so happy serving Him, and I fought against that to....a real Jonah experience. Today many are being deceived, it is every where, and I just want to remind you wolves in sheep's clothing are in churches and ministries too.....test the spirits and test them again, ask for discernment and use it. If you ask a person if they believe in God is don't be deceived Satan believes in God also, he knows the scriptures frontwards and backwards, and sometimes twists just one word, or one hair split in a plan, and boom. Just because someone is out of a family of born again parents does not mean that the kids are saved, each person is accountable for his/her own sins; remember; all have sinned and have fallen short of the glory of God...ALL NO exceptions, the person if saved the slate is wiped clean as sin cannot enter heaven or anything impure...eye opening, too, huh?? If you have a gut churning feeling something is not right, seek God,....pray....look up scripture for your situation in the Bible, if you cannot find the Word for the situation than what action does it concern the outcome, than look that up, if still nothing than pray again, and wait on God for His plan and will for you. Ask for confirmation. Don't settle for permissive will, wait for God's perfect will......If you have made a new error, than repent....and remember there is no condemnation only conviction. Condemnation is not from God, nor is confusion, nor is strife. Watch out for razzle dazzle them to....blind them with the confusion, doubt, lust and than hit them with the shiny stuff the dazzle and boom you bought it hook, line and sinker and you will sink.....

The Sinful Woman...There is not the slightest basis for identifying this woman with Mary Magdalene, or with Mary of Bethany. This anointing is NOT the same as the anointing at Bethany (John 12:1-8). An oriental banner was a sort of public affair. Jesus half reclining on a couch, His face toward the table, His knees bent back, it was easy for the woman to approach. Weeping, kissing His feet, bathing them with the costly perfume, and wiping a way the falling tears with her hair, how she puts us people to shame in thus bowing low in abject humility and devoted adoration at the feet of her Lord. Jesus was very tender in His attitude toward women, who had made a mis-step (John 4:18; 8:1-11). Yet no one ever attributed to Him questionable motives (John 4:17).

The Woman was a woman with a past, she sold her love by the hour; she was a prostitute. The Pharisee called her and especially wicked sinner, her presence in the Bible and in Jesus' life shows us that God does not always call people with wonderful pasts to serve Him. We also learn from this woman that He does call people with a negative past to a powerful, blessed future. Just because you did not have a good beginning in life does not mean that you cannot have a great finish. Since she was a prostitute, the perfume was probably either a gift from one of her clients or purchased with money she earned from her profession. Other people probably viewed her act of love as erotic because of her past, but Jesus knew it was an act of pure love. When our past is unpleasant, people often misjudge our actions, and we find ourselves caught up in the approval game, trying to convince others that we are acceptable. People do not forget our past as easily as God does, nor their pasts. The Pharisee could not understand why Jesus allowed the woman to even touch Him, but Jesus responded to this by saying that those who have been forgiven much will love much (Luke 7:47). She wanted to give Him the most expensive or her most precious gift, one of her treasures, she just wanted to serve Him, even using her own tears or sorrow to clean His feet. He saw her heart, just as He sees yours.....verse 42..When they had no means of paying, he freely forgave them both. Now which of them will love Him more? 43...Simon answered, the one I take it for whom He forgave and cancelled more. And Jesus said to him, you have decided correctly 44... Then turning toward the woman, He said to Simon, do you see this woman? When I came into your house, you gave Me no water for My feet, but she ha wet My feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. 45...You gave Me no kiss, but she from the moment I came in has not ceased to kiss My feet tenderly and caressingly. 46...You did not anoint My head with oil, but she has anointed My feet with perfume. 47...Therefore I tell you, her sins, many are forgiven her, because she has loved much, but he who is forgiven little loves little. 48...And He said to her, your sins are forgiven......

Anointed—a-noint', a-noint'-ed (aleipho, chrio): Refers to a very general practice in the East. It originated from the relief from the effect of the sun that was experienced in rubbing the body with oil or grease. Among rude people the common vegetable or animal fat was used. As society advanced and refinement became a part of civilization, delicately perfumed ointments were used for this purpose. Other reasons soon obtained for this practice than that stated above. Persons were anointed for health (Mark 6:13), because of the widespread belief in the healing power of oil. It was often employed as a mark of hospitality (Luke 7:46); as a mark of special honor (John 11:2); in preparation for social occasions (Ruth 3:3 2 Samuel 14:2 Isaiah 61:3). The figurative use of this word (chrio) has reference strictly to the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the individual (Luke 4:18 Acts 4:27; Acts 10:38). In this sense it is God who anoints (Hebrews 1:9 2 Corinthians 1:21). The thought is to appoint, or qualify for a special dignity, function or privilege. It is in this sense that the word is applied to Christ (John 1:41 m; Acts 4:27; Acts 10:38 Hebrews 1:9; compare Psalm 2:2 Daniel 9:25).
