"Eutychus sat on a window-sill when Paul was preaching (Acts 20). He fell asleep, fell out of the building and died – though Paul restored him back to life. Sitting on the window-sill means that Eutychus was neither inside nor outside the church; He and others in that position never fall in but always out. This is dangerous. C'mon! Get serious with Jesus. Make a public stand for Christ." REINHARD BONNKE

Macedonia was the northern part of Greece. Paul's plan was to collect an offering from the Gentile churches to help the suffering church in Jerusalem, the area then known as Greece was the area around Corinth. Several men from the various churches were accompanying Paul, probably carrying the offerings from their individual churches, to present to the church in Jerusalem as a sign of Christian love and solidarity.

(v. 6) Luke uses "we" to indicate that he also accompanied Paul. " But **we** [ourselves] sailed from Philippi after the days of Unleavened Bread [the Passover week], and in five days we joined them at Troas, where we remained for seven days."

The early Church believed that Sunday was the best day to observe communion, since Jesus was resurrected on a Sunday Jesus didn't specify how often to have communion or what day was best to gather for worship. Anything practiced often becomes a ritual and grows meaningless. We want our worship to be deeply felt in our hearts.

(v. 8) The lights in the room were candles, they probably made the room very smoky and stuffy.

(v. 9) Eutychus was sitting in the window getting fresh air, but the gases and smoke from the candles were escaping out the window, which may have caused him to fall asleep. He fell out the window backwards into the courtyard three floors below the upper room where they were meeting. ( note in verse 7; And on the first day of the week, when we were assembled together to break bread [the Lord's Supper]. Paul discoursed with them, intending to leave the next morning, and he kept on with his message until midnight...so the teaching probably started in the morning and lasted until midnight...so maybe...we don't know for sure...a 12-14 hour teaching..if they started in the morning.....at say 10 AM.....just a thought, I would think if it was warm, not many breaks and hanging on every word being spoken a person would still get sleepy.) God preserved the life of the young man, to the comfort of all the Christians gathered there. Paul had went down and bent over him and embraced him, saying, make no ado, his life is within him....Paul went back upstairs and had broken bread and eaten [with them ] and after he had talked confidentially and communed with them for a considerable time until daybreak [in fact}, than he departed. (...so we can assume Paul's teaching from, if started at 10 AM and until daybreak 4 or 5 AM, would have been a....16 or 17 hour...teaching at one sitting). All our work and service should be done as unto the Lord. Knowing we are working unto Him makes many tasks more bearable. Paul's preaching was by word and example. Abide means await. Paul wasn't moved by the afflictions he had to endure from following God's will. He was willing to serve God faithfully until he'd finished all that God had for him to do on the earth. Paul's ministry was to testify of the good news (gospel) of God's grace. Paul had shared and taught everything God had put on his heart to tell them, so he had done his duty toward them. ( note that Paul's ministry lasted 12 years from A.D. 45 to 57. The result was a number of powerful Christian centers, planted in almost every city of Asia Minor and Greece.) Now they were responsible to God for the flocks of God in their churches (Ezekiel 3:18,19). The Holy Spirit not men on a board or committee had made these men the elders in their churches. The continuing obligation of the elders and pastor of a church is to feed the flock of God. We only grow by feeding on the Word of God. (v. 28) This verse speaks of Jesus as God, for Jesus purchased the Church with His own blood.

There are still wolves going around trying to draw lambs away from the flock in order to devour them. Paul was upset when he thought of men coming in and tearing up the work that had been done. God's Word is able to build and strengthen us and to bring us into the inheritance. ( today the wolves are rampant, so stay in the Word and read it and listen to it daily, we see all around us how extensive it is, use discernment and test everything and all spirits....for the scripture also....says....."if we faint not" so be on your guard and be ready with a answer in season and out of season.) (Don't forget also it is said in the Word that in the last days there will be a falling away, the pressures, of things going on around us, that is becoming evident today to, so, fellowship and friends coming along beside a friend, build a net work....today it is urgent and more important than ever....people loosing jobs, homes.....etc....)


