...But Jesus said this to prove (test) him (Philip), for He well knew what He was about to do....Philip answered Him. Two hundred pennies (forty dollars) worth of bread is not enough that everyone may receive even a little. Andrew said to Him. There is a little boy here, who has [with him] five barley loaves, and two small fish, but what are they among so many people? Jesus said; Make all the people recline (sit down). Now the ground (a pasture) was covered with thick grass at the spot so the men threw themselves down about 5,000 in number. Jesus took the loaves, and when He had given thanks. He distributed to the disciples and the disciples to the reclining people; so also [He did] with the fish, as much as they wanted. When they had all had enough. He said to His disciples. Gather up now the fragments (the broken pieces that are left over), so that nothing may be lost and wasted. So accordingly they gathered them up, and they filled twelve [small hand] baskets with fragments left over by those who had eaten from the five barley loaves.....

This is the only one of Jesus' miracles told in all four Gospels (John 6:5-13; Matthew 14:13-33; Mark 6:32-52; Luke 9:10-17). The place was on the northeast shore of the Sea of Galilee; two miles southeast of the Jordan entrance fits the description. The time was Passover (6:4), one year before Jesus' death, when the passing multitudes were on their way to Jerusalem. Jesus Himself did not go to Jerusalem this Passover, because on His previous visit they had formed a plot to kill Him (John 5:1, 18). It was probably the first Passover He had missed going to Jerusalem since He was 12. He celebrated it by working one of His most marvelous miracles for the Passover-bound multitudes. Did you notice how Jesus loves order? He made the people sit down in companies of 50's and 100's (Mark 6:39-40), probably arranged around Him in a circle or semi-circle. He was not wasteful, He commanded that the left-overs be gathered up (12-13). To be filled literally means glutted. The people wanted to enthrone Him as king immediately (14-15), this was a premature effort to make Him their king. ...

When evening came, His disciples went down to the sea, and they took a boat and were going across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and still Jesus had not [yet] come back to them. Meanwhile, the sea was getting rough and rising high because of a great and violent wind that was blowing. [However] when they had rowed three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and approaching the boat, and they were afraid (terrified). This was in the fourth watch (Mark 6:48), after three in the morning. Jesus had spent most of the night alone in the mountain, probably praying..(Mark 6:46). The disciples were rowing to Capernaum (John 6:17), by way of Bethsaida (Mark 6:45). Bethsaida was at the Jordan entrance. Capernaum was about five miles southwest of the Jordan entrance. They were hugging the shore, because of the storm. When Jesus appeared they were "25 or 30 furlongs" out, that is, about 3 or 4 miles, half way across. When Peter saw Jesus walking on the water he wanted to do it too, but he began to sink. Jesus chided him for his lack of faith. To us it seems that Peter had a good deal of faith, to even try it, a good deal according to man's way of looking at things, but in Jesus' eyes so little.

The discourse on the Bread of Life (22-71)...Jesus had worked the mighty miracle as a setting for a plain talk on His true mission in the world. While He had spent much time ministering to men's bodily needs, the real purpose of His coming into the world was to save men's souls. When He told them that they began to lose interest, as long as He fed their bodies they thought He was great. They wanted Him to be their king. It seems that the people generally were expecting the Messiah to bring in a social order in which men could get their bread without working. It would have been wonderful if they could have had a king who would every day feed them miraculously, as He had done the day before, as Moses had given the daily manna.

Man had already failed in doing the works of God by the Law (Micah 6:8; Matthew 5:48). All that God requires of us now is to believe on Jesus Christ (Romans 4:5-8). Our souls can only find rest by faith in Christ. The purposes of God will still be accomplished, they aren't dependent upon man (Esther 4:13-14; Acts 13:48). **(44) No one is able to come to Me unless the Father Who sent Me attracts and draws him and gives him the desire to come to Me, and [then] I will raise him up [from the dead] at the last day.** This shows the fallacy of our own arguments and efforts to draw others to Christ. Our requirement is to bear witness of Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit will do the rest. Some times we are a silent witness, how we live and act each day people are watching it is a silent witness....if we always respond in anger, hate and condemnation than what have we learned about loving our neighbors as ourselves, first we are to love God....the example we set may turn people away from God...if they see us sinning, hating..drunk, drugged, porn, fighting with a spouse.....why would they want to join the family?? If we profess to being Christian but we are partying hardy, sleeping around.....than they can also say well hey I already do that so I am a Christian if they are.....God will not be mocked.....if you question if you are a Christian than you aren't. You need to go to Jesus and get it right.....While at the hospital where my husband had surgery, a lady that I helped whom had been severely abused 25 years earlier, was telling me about her life now....when I told her that I am a pastor she said I knew there was something different about you even than.....so I said, so tell me are you saved?? She stated well I and my new husband have went to church from time to time, but I don't know I am not sure if I am saved...so I go well we can take care of that right now.....she goes right here in the hallway of the hospital?? I go yes...so we stepped to the side of the hall, and I helped her to do the sinners prayer, to confess Jesus Christ is Lord. She was so happy and I said now you have NO question that you are saved, please find a good Church that teaches the Word and is filled with the Holy Spirit, if you need help finding one I will help you.....15 mins. Later my husband died....

Not a very good time, but guess whom heard about it because she worked in the lab, and came running down the hall, and into the "quiet room" (a room where they send people when a loved one dies for privacy). I had refused to go into the room because I knew in my spirit that they were coming to tell me, that he had died. They almost had to drag me in...the security guards grabbed hold of my arms, and that was the wrong move to make....so let us say they released my arms. It is always fight or flight and I fight....The doctor walked in....and told me....I looked at him and I said....again?? He said what do you mean again?? I go....my first husband died from disease also....so again?? I have to go through it again?? I was standing their sobbing and the girl from the lab walked in, I just looked at her dumb founded, and she opened her arms....and I go why would you want to hug me (shock/pain)??....she goes because you are the woman that saved my life and my babies 25 years ago when my husband than threw us out in the blizzard, I had no shoes, coat and no blanket for the baby, and you jumped out of your car, and said; " I don't think so" and put me and the baby in your car, we had been outside for twenty minutes or so.....my husband might have killed you or beat you and your husband but you still did and we might be dead if you had not, and than one week later you told me to leave my husband and go to a safe place and we did, because of what you did I am alive today....and right now I just want to hold you and maybe take some of your pain away.....so she did till my daughter got there....and than she just vanished.....I thought about it later, and realized God put that in motion....25 years ago she had a need, as a silent witness....I helped.....25 years later I lead her to Jesus Christ....I had a need that day and she supplied that need, she had become a silent witness....God lined all that up 25 years earlier and when I needed someone in that painful situation, He had someone there waiting and willing....until my family came....so I say to you one act of kindness in love....and how you live is a silent witness.....and you just never know where it may lead if not that day than years later....Thank youJesus.

The people in John 6:28 wanted to know what they needed to do to please God. They wanted to know what to do in order to work the works of God. What was Jesus' answer?? "This is the work (service) that God asks of you that you believe in the One Whom He has sent (John 6:29). Just believe..... We think we are supposed to be achievers, and we are, but the way we achieve is first believe. This frees us from worry and reasoning and enables us to live victorious, blessed lives. God has works for us to do, but faith must come first and works will follow. When done in faith, works are easy and God gets the credit instead of us. Faith without works is dead, but we must be careful not to get the cart before the horse. When we do that , we struggle and make every effort, yet we see no progress. We are called believers, not achievers. Our first and foremost work is always to believe..... Just believe and receive Him.....He says " come " I am willing.....

- 1 Fret not yourself because of evildoers, neither be you envious against the workers of iniquity. Prov 23:17; Prov 24:1;
- 2 For they shall soon be cut down like the grass, and wither as the green herb.
- 3 Trust in the LORD, and do good; so shall you dwell in the land, and truly you shall be fed.
- 4 Delight yourself also in the LORD: and he shall give you the desires of your heart.
- 5 Commit your way to the LORD; trust also in him; and he shall bring it to pass. Ps 22:8; Ps 55:22; Prov 16:3; Matt 6:25; Luke 12:22; 1 Pet 5:7;
- 6 And he shall bring forth your righteousness as the light, and your judgment as the noonday.
- 7 Rest in the LORD, and wait patiently for him: fret not yourself because of him who prospers in his way, because of the man who brings wicked devices to pass.
- 8 Cease from anger, and forsake wrath: fret not yourself in any wise to do evil.
- 9 For evildoers shall be cut off: but those that wait on the LORD, they shall inherit the earth.
- 10 For yet a little while, and the wicked shall not be: yes, you shall diligently consider his place, and it shall not be.
- 11 But the meek shall inherit the earth; and shall delight themselves in the abundance of peace. Matt 5:5;
- 12 The wicked plots against the just, and gnashes on him with his teeth.
- 13 The LORD shall laugh at him: for he sees that his day is coming.
- 14 The wicked have drawn out the sword, and have bent their bow, to cast down the poor and needy, and to slay such as be of upright conversation.
- 15 Their sword shall enter into their own heart, and their bows shall be broken.
- 16 A little that a righteous man has is better than the riches of many wicked.
- 17 For the arms of the wicked shall be broken: but the LORD upholds the righteous.
- 18 The LORD knows the days of the upright: and their inheritance shall be for ever.
- 19 They shall not be ashamed in the evil time: and in the days of famine they shall be satisfied.
- 20 But the wicked shall perish, and the enemies of the LORD shall be as the fat of lambs: they shall consume; into smoke shall they consume away.
- 21 The wicked borrows, and pays not again: but the righteous shows mercy, and gives.
- 22 For such as be blessed of him shall inherit the earth; and they that be cursed of him shall be cut off.
- 23 The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD: and he delights in his way.
- 24 Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down: for the LORD upholds him with his hand.
- 25 I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread.
- 26 He is ever merciful, and lends; and his seed is blessed.
- 27 Depart from evil, and do good; and dwell for ever more.
- 28 For the LORD loves judgment, and forsakes not his saints; they are preserved for ever: but the seed of the wicked shall be cut off.
- 29 The righteous shall inherit the land, and dwell therein for ever.
- 30 The mouth of the righteous speaks wisdom, and his tongue talks of judgment.
- 31 The law of his God is in his heart; none of his steps shall slide. Ps 40:8; Isa 51:7;
- 32 The wicked watches the righteous, and seeks to slay him.
- 33 The LORD will not leave him in his hand, nor condemn him when he is judged.
- 34 Wait on the LORD, and keep his way, and he shall exalt you to inherit the land: when the wicked are cut off, you shall see it.
- 35 I have seen the wicked in great power, and spreading himself like a green bay tree.
- 36 Yet he passed away, and, see, he was not: yes, I sought him, but he could not be found.
- 37 Mark the perfect man, and behold the upright: for the end of that man is peace.
- 38 But the transgressors shall be destroyed together: the end of the wicked shall be cut off.
- 39 But the salvation of the righteous is of the LORD: he is their strength in the time of trouble.
- 40 And the LORD shall help them, and deliver them: he shall deliver them from the wicked, and save them, because they trust in him.
