

Jesus; washes their feet (13:1-20). This was occasioned by their contention among themselves as to which of them were to have the chief offices in the Kingdom. This had been one of their standing problems, in spite of Jesus' repeated statements that He was going to be crucified, which they somehow, even to the last, took to be parables, they seemed to think that the triumphal entry, five days before, portended that it was about time for Him to erect the throne of a world empire in Jerusalem. Jesus finally had to get down on His hands and knees and wash their feet, the menial service of a slave, to burn into their minds that He had called them to serve, and not to rule. The Church has suffered through all the centuries because so many of its leaders have been consumed by the passion to be great. Organizations and high offices have been created to satisfy men's worldly and selfish ambitions. Churchmen, instead of humbly serving Christ have used the name of Christ to serve themselves. Jesus knew the end ha come, He was ready for it. Instead of calling it crucified he called it glorified. He dreaded the pain, but kept His eye on the joy beyond the pain. They were mystified at His statement that He was leaving them, they wondered what that could mean. Had He not told them over and over? We think His heart must have ached for them more that it did at the thought of His own suffering.

Jesus was saying they must tale the position of servant. There are three criteria used to establish for general Church practice; it must be taught by Christ; there must be an example in the Book of Acts; there must be practical teaching on it in the epistles. Thus, we hold water baptisms and the Lord's Supper. Foot washing aren't mentioned in the Book of Acts or epistles, and thus are not considered to be a continuing church practice.

In our relationship with Him, Jesus calls us to sacrifice our self-will. We are not to be served but to serve. We are to be sensitive to other people's needs, even in little things. We like Jesus should seek to serve others rather than merely letting them serve us. When we have people in our lives who serve us in various ways we should always treat them with the utmost respect and be good to them.

Have you ever wondered what the best way to tell someone about Jesus is? The answer is, love them. Live out of selfless, sacrificial love that you have received from Jesus. Extend that love to those who have not trusted Him as Lord and Savior, and your actions will speak loudly about who Jesus is and what He is all about. The real power of love is seen in how we treat one another. We must be patient, kind, humble ready to believe the best at all times, not easily provoked or offended and ready to lay aside our rights for other people? Are we ready to quickly and frequently forgive, and to never keep records of wrongs that we have suffered? Will we endure everything without weakening and bear with the failings of the weak? The willingness to do these things is what love is all about. Love is an effort and it always costs us something. People today are looking for the easy road, but that is one that leads to destruction. Take the narrow road, the one which people who are willing to treat others as they want to be treated travel. But when I became an adult, I set aside childish ways. 12 For now we see in a mirror indirectly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know in part, but then I will know fully, just as I have been fully known. 2 Cor 3:18; 13 And now these three remain: faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love.
